## Carmanah Delivers \$1 Million (USD) in Solar-Powered Perimeter Fence Lighting



VICTORIA, British Columbia, May 04, 2010 (BUSINESS WIRE) -- A power generating facility in the United States is illuminating its perimeter fencing with \$1 million (USD) of solar-powered LED streetlights provided by Carmanah Technologies.
